MINUTES  
SEPTEMBER 23, 1991**

The meeting was called to order at 3:40 P.M. Ms. Standley informed the committee that changes passed by the GPC regarding the S/U course option at its September 9, 1991 meeting did not fully address the issue of the number of S/U hours allowed for the College of Law and presented the following proposed change that would appear in the first sentence of the S/U Course Option policy on page 36 of the Graduate Bulletin.

..... a student may enroll in as many as six (6) semester hours during the master's degree program or up to nine (9) semester hours during the doctoral program, **or as many as one course per semester in the 2nd and 3rd year of law school** on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

It was **moved** by Mr. Johnsen to accept the above addition. The motion was **seconded** by Mr. Slagle and **passed**.

Ms. Standley informed the committee that a mail ballot will be sent to the GPC members who could not attend today's meeting for them to vote on the proposed change.

Ms. Standley further requested approval for a language change on this same recommendation as passed by the committee on September 9, 1991, to **delete** the words **or designee** from the appropriate areas of the recommendation, as this wording is not necessary for the clarity of the recommendation.

It was **moved** by Mr. Edwards to accept the language deletion. The motion was **seconded** by Mr. Outlaw and **passed**.

The entire section as corrected now reads:

With the permission of the major professor or chairperson of the student's major department, **or dean of the professional degree program**, a student may enroll in as many as six (6) semester hours during the master's degree program or up to nine (9) semester hours during the doctoral program, **or as many as one course per semester in the 2nd or 3rd year of law school** on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis. A student's registration in a course under the S/U option must be indicated on the proper form to the Office of the University Registrar from the major professor, chairperson **or dean** of the student's major department **or professional degree program**. A student may change to a regular-grade (A, B, C) basis during the first four weeks of the term, but may not change to an S/U basis after the fifth day of classes (**except in the Law School where the deadline for selecting the S/U option will be the end of the fifth week of Law School classes**).

The meeting was adjourned at 4:45 P.M.
