When reviewing the program, the review committee shall determine whether "at the end of five years[that is, five years after receiving doctoral directive status] a faculty member's . . . teaching and research has continued to be of at least the quality that justified the original appointment" to doctoral directive status. After such determination, the review committee shall make a recommendation that each faculty member in the program either retain doctoral directive status or be reconsidered by the college committee for such status through the procedures used in the original appointment.
